A new K-6 academic program at Hancock!

ADSIS stands for "Alternative Delivery of Specialized Instructional Services". This is a new opportunity at the Hancock School for K-6 students to receive additional support in the areas of reading and mathematics. This program is funded through the Minnesota Department of Education and follows set guidelines. As a school, we need to apply for the funding every two years and submit annual reports.

In order for your student to be eligible for ADSIS support, he/she is screened three times a year (September, January, May) using FASTBridge and NWEA assessments in reading and mathematics. Your 4th-6th grade student's previous year's MCA is also taken into account. Your student's scores must be below the target range in two of the three areas screened in either reading or mathematics.

If your student qualifies for ADSIS support, you will be contacted and your student will begin receiving support unless you indicate otherwise. If your student is already receiving special education services in the area of reading or mathematics, ADSIS is unable to provide services for him/her.
