PRAIRIE WOODS FIELD TRIP

The 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade classes were granted a grant for a Science and Environmental field trip. This year the classes went to Prairie Woods Environmental Learning Center in Spicer. Since there are so many students in grades 3–5, each grade went on a separate day. This ensured smaller group sizes and the same grade level of information to be taught at the field trip. At Prairie Woods the students rotated through 3 stations to learn about animals and nature in small groups. These stations included the topics: trees, insects, and predators and prey. The stations were very engaging! The kids learned facts and played games that involved the facts they learned. The field trips were great successes! The students, parent chaperones, and teachers all had positive remarks about the field trips! Thank you so much for allowing the students the opportunity to take their learning outside!

AUTHOR VISIT

Hancock Public Schools hosted a visit from Kevin Lovegreen, author of the Lucky Luke's Adventure series using funds awarded by the Hancock School Foundation. Students in Kindergarten through 8th grade had the opportunity to participate in one of three presentations where the author took them on an educational and entertaining journey into the world of writing and illustrating children's books. Kevin highlighted the team of uniquely skilled individuals that work together to create a book (Author, Editor, Illustrator, Designer). Next Lovegreen had fun explaining where his story ideas come from. Each book is based on true encounters and the kids loved hearing the author describe some of the adventures. Finally, Kevin challenged students to identify different animal calls and then shared a video of each of the animals as they were revealed. Students had the opportunity to purchase autographed books.


